Grade 6 students improve their performance by 28% compared to 2004, while Grade 9 cohort surpasses 2004 results by 41 percentage points.

North Bay, September 25, 2007 – The *Conseil scolaire public du Nord-Est de l'Ontario* is proud to announce the 2006-07 results of its students in the Provincial Assessments for the Primary and the Junior Divisions, as well as the Grade 9 results in the Mathematics Assessment.

At the Primary Division, 56% of CSDNE students have attained or surpassed the provincial average of 63%. At the Junior Division, 57% have attained or surpassed the provincial average of 73%.

The 2006-07 Grade 6 cohort improved its performance by 28% compared to the results it obtained at the Grade 3 level in 2003-04.

In the Grade 9 Mathematics Assessment, applied level, an average of 66% of CSDNE students attained or surpassed the provincial average of 33%, while at the advanced level, the average was 61% compared to the provincial average of 70%. These results represent an overall success rate of 64% compared to the provincial average of 52%.

It is worth mentioning that the 2006-07 Grade 9 cohort made great progress compared to the 2003-04 cohort at the applied level, going from 23% to 66% for a 43% increase. At the advanced level, the success rate went from 23% to 61% for a 38% increase. This represents an overall increase of 41 percentage points between 2004 and 2007.

Mr. Ghislain Beaupré, Superintendent of Education, congratulates all students who took part in the Provincial Assessments during 2006-07. "The improved performance of our cohorts can be attributed to the implementation of learning strategies promoted by the Ministry of Education and also to the creation of collaborative teams."
